We all will be taking advantage of the Narcan Training sessions that happen monthly at the library. I did the training this month and am so glad I did.

In other news Beth, Helene and I took a trip to the Greene County Historical Society and had a great tour of the building. We hope to collaborate with them on a newspaper digitization project in the future.
