

**Our ongoing programs include:**

- Weekly visits to the Robert C. Antonelli Senior Center
- Alternating week visits to Home Sweet Home on the Hudson, the Eliot at Catskill, and Hearthstone Care Adult Day Center and In-home Care.
- Weekly visits from an ARC group.
- A High School Equivalency and an English as a New Language class each meet twice weekly.
- Monthly Narcan training sponsored by Youth Clubhouses of Columbia and Greene Counties.

**Other programs:**

- Jonathan Palmer, the Greene County Historian, had to suspend his monthly “office hours” at the library, because he has a new full-time job. He had five people come to his first appearance and seven at his second. He hopes to come again when his new work schedule is settled.

**From March/April:**
