

**Summer reading recap:**

We had 25 adults sign up for the summer reading program. 8 people entered the drawing to win the Samsung Galaxy tablet. 5 people had 1 entry, 1 had 12 entries, 1 had 44 entries and 1 individual had 55 entries (and won the tablet), for a total of 116 entries. In 2023, we did not ask people to register, but 17 people took bingo sheets (which were more involved than this year's passports), and 7 returned them, with a total of 19 raffle entries.

**Miscellaneous:**

The D-Day Talk took place on Saturday, the 7th. There were seven people there, and all were really into it. I plan to ask the presenter to come again.

The book club continues to meet monthly and have lively discussions.

I have been working on the Essential Documents Inventory, which is part of the Minimum Standards for Public Libraries required by New York State. We have most of what is required already. Much of the work has been locating the documents and gathering them to send to MHLS, who will then forward them to the State.

We will be expanding our collection of museum passes. I am just starting on this project. I checked to see which passes are already offered in the MHLS system and will investigate where those museums are located and how often the passes have been used to determine which may be most popular with our patrons, and I will look for other local museums that may not yet be available through an MHLS library.

Christopher and I represented the library at Greene County Senior Citizens' Day, held at the Historic Warehouse at Catskill Point. Details will be included in next month's report.

I picked up voter registration forms from the Greene County Board of Elections with their address pre-printed on them to give to anyone who wants to register to vote. We will also mail the forms for them. National Voter Registration Day was September 17th.

Our main floor staff have been working on book displays for September events, including Banned Book Week and Hispanic and Latino Heritage Month.

We received a mini-grant from MHLS to expand our Spanish-language and English for Speakers of Other Languages collections for all ages, both physical and e-materials.
